30	San Carlos Borromeo de Carmelo	1770–1834	Relocated: climate, proximity to presidio at Monterey
31	San Antonio de Padua	1771–1835	Relocated 1773: lack of water
32	San Gabriel Arcángel	1771–1834	Relocated 1791: flood
33	San Luis Obispo de Tolosa	1772–1835	Rebuilt 1776: burned by natives
34	San Juan Capistrano	1776–1835	Relocated 1778: lack of water
35	San Francisco de Asís (Dolores)	1776–1835	Unchanged despite poor location and climate
36	Santa Clara de Asís	1777–1836	Relocated 4 times: flooding
37	San Buenaventura	1782–1837	Unchanged
38	Santa Barbara Virgen y Mártir	1786–1834	Unchanged
39	La Purísima Concepción de Maria Santísima	1787–1835	Relocated 1812: earthquake
40	Santa Cruz	1791–1834	Unchanged
