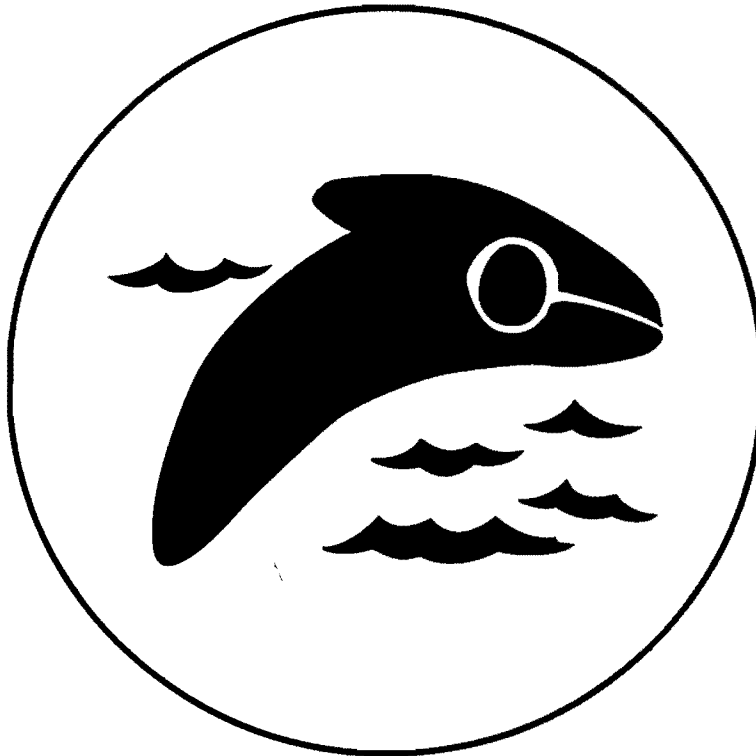

## Pacific Coast Archaeological Society Quarterly

The *Pacific Coast Archaeological Society Quarterly* is a publication of the Pacific Coast Archaeological Society (PCAS), which was organized in 1961. PCAS is an avocational group formed to study and to preserve the anthropological and archaeological history of the original inhabitants of Orange County, California, and contiguous areas.

The Publications Committee invites the submittal of contributions dealing with the history and prehistory of the area as exemplified by observation or investigation. Although PCAS is especially interested in reports which shed further light on the early inhabitants of Orange County, it is also interested in reports on the wider Pacific Coast area.

Subscription to the *Pacific Coast Archaeological Society Quarterly* costs \$32 per calendar year. The PCAS also publishes a monthly newsletter, which costs \$10 per calendar year. There is an additional postage charge for foreign subscriptions: \$9 for the *Pacific Coast Archaeological Society Quarterly* and \$4 for the *PCAS Newsletter*. Back issues of the *Pacific Coast Archaeological Society Quarterly* are available for \$10 per copy. A complete list of the articles in previous issues is included in the 25-year index published as Volume 25, Number 4, and the index supplement published in Volume 32. Two *Occasional Papers*, one on Catalina Island and one on Mexican Majolica, also have been published by PCAS.
