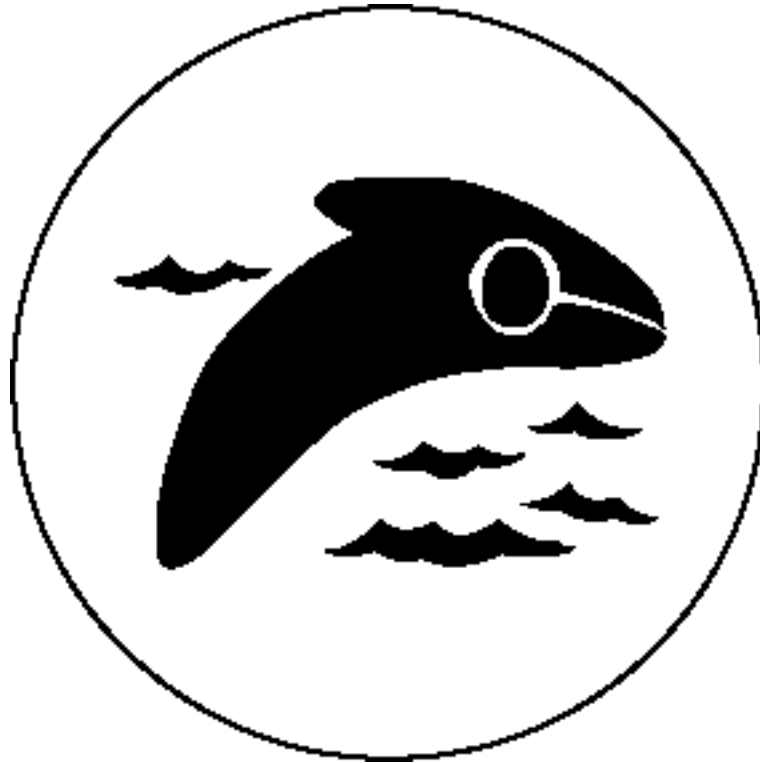

The Publications Committee invites the submittal of contributions dealing with the history and prehistory of the area as exemplified by observation or investigation. Although PCAS is especially interested in reports which shed further light on the early inhabitants of Orange County, it is also interested in reports on the wider Pacific Coast area.

Subscription to the *Pacific Coast Archaeological Society Quarterly* costs \$32 per calendar year. The PCAS also publishes a monthly newsletter, which costs \$10 per calendar year. There is an additional postage charge for foreign subscriptions: \$9 for the *Pacific Coast Archaeological Society Quarterly* and \$4 for the *PCAS Newsletter*. Back issues of the *Pacific Coast Archaeological Society Quarterly* are available for \$10 per copy. Information for Authors

The *Pacific Coast Archaeological Society Quarterly* is a juried journal which publishes papers in the field of archaeology and related disciplines concerning the Pacific Coast and adjacent areas.

Manuscripts are published in the approximate order of receipt within the limits of space demands, issue balance, and needs of time-related material. Papers are accepted with the understanding that they have not been published or submitted for publications elsewhere. Authors may wish to submit an abstract and outline of a paper for preliminary opinion before preparing the manuscript for submission. In general, an acceptable version of the manuscript should be in the hands of the Publications Committee three months prior to its anticipated publication date.

Organization

An “Abstract” paragraph should begin all manuscripts (though the Publications Committee may omit printing it, if judged unnecessary for brief papers). The Abstract should concisely present the content and conclusions. It is brief, avoids detail and qualifying phrases, and is not a statement of intent. It must be intelligible in itself without reference to the paper that follows.

The manuscript should include centered headings and side headings (in standard typeface) to guide the reader. Footnotes are not used, although a minimum of supplementary end notes can be accepted if judged absolutely necessary.

“Acknowledgements” may be placed before the References list.

Style

The *Chicago Manual of Style* (University of Chicago Press) and major professional journals of anthropology and archaeology are used as guides in PCAS publications. Authors are requested to review their drafts carefully for clarity of expression and avoidance of unnecessary jargon.

The author is responsible for accurate spelling, punctuation, grammar, and syntax. The aim of all editing is to present the author’s material in the best possible manner with both the author and the reader in mind. The Publications Committee may make minor changes, in consultation with the author when possible.

Scientific names should be used for biotic references together with common names. Check carefully for accurate spelling and capitalization.

Radiocarbon dates should normally be expressed in the general text as an historical age with specific examples, A.D. 460±150. If dates are presented in a special section or table, details should be in the ¹⁴C Yrs BP format. This in turn should be followed by the laboratory assay number and citation.

Manuscript preparation

For jury purposes, submit three copies of the manuscript, typed double-space throughout, single side, on standard 8.5 by 11 inch paper. The author's name or initials, date, and page numbers should be in the upper left corner of each page. It is helpful to editors and reviewers if xerographic copies of photographs and drawn figures can be included with the manuscript.

The author will make any necessary revisions of the manuscripts after receiving juror comments and editing notes. The author will send the final version on computer disk if available (see below) and one paper copy.

If the manuscript is prepared on a regular typewriter, a ribbon should be used that produces clean, crisp, dense, high-contrast black letters in neat lines for possible electronic scanning for computer processing.

Computers/Word processors

Authors using computers must print double-space with standard typefaces in 10 or 12 point size. Do not use special typefaces or point sizes for titles or headings. If the printer does not show diacritical marks prominently, they should be carefully added by hand with a pen.

A disk copy should be furnished after the final editing. Disk files should be WordPerfect or MS Word or Clarisworks, or in ASCII (text-only format). We accept double density or high density disks formatted as either PC or Macintosh, but they must be the smaller, 3.5 inch size.

References

All in-text citations of the literature should include the author, date, and pages: "as she stated (McKinney 1968:48)." or else "...as stated by McKinney (1968:48)."

Only works actually cited should be listed under the heading "References Cited." The entries should be double-spaced and listed alphabetically and chronologically by author. "Vol.", "No.", and "pp." may be omitted where clear. Include the information as shown the following example:

McKinney, Aileen

1968 Cogged Stones in Private Collections. Pacific Coast Archaeological Society Quarterly, 4(3):39-55. Costa Mesa.

All references must be carefully checked for accuracy of detail against the original publications (not from notes or other published lists). Details include full titles, original spelling and diacritical marks (accents), and completeness of standard data such as the publication series, publisher, and place of publication. Abbreviations of series or journal

names are not acceptable. Author's full names are used as in the cited publication rather than initials. Use standard upper/lower case letters (no all-upper-case) for names and titles.

Illustrations

All illustrations (photographs, drawings, maps) should be in a single numbered series of "figures" ("Fig." in text and captions). The maximum image size that we can print is six inches by nine inches. We will reduce illustrations to fit, if necessary.

Line work should be black on white. Due to cost, we do not publish color images.

Drawings and maps should include graphic scales within the drawings. Scales may be expressed in captions as measurements of one or more of the depicted objects. Scales such as "actual size" or "1/5 scale can not be used because figures may be reduced, or enlarged, before they are printed.

Photographs should be glossy black-and-white prints or 65-line screen halftone images, with good contrast. Color photos will be published as black and white images.

Tables are normally incorporated into the text. Use tabs, not spaces, to delimit columns in the disk copy.

Original illustrations will be returned to the author, if a stamped, self-addressed envelope accompanies the submission.

Figures can be submitted on disk, if they are formatted as TIFF files. Do not compress TIFF files, because we may not be able to open the files with our software.

The author is responsible to obtain permission to use materials protected by copyright, and to pay any fees required by the copyright owner. The author should send permission to PCAS when the manuscript has been accepted, before it is published. See *The Chicago Manual of Style* for an example of the permission request letter.

Biography

Authors should submit with the manuscript a brief biography for publication in the "About the Authors" section. It should be about 75 words and may include academic degrees, professional affiliations, research experience, major publications, and special interests. The author's address may be included.

Pacific Coast Archaeological Society Code of Ethics

The Pacific Coast Archaeological Society (PCAS) is a non profit group of professional and avocational people dedicated to proper management of our cultural resources, to public education and to the protection and preservation of archaeological materials and collections.

The following principles have been adopted by the PCAS.

1. Professional methods and forms will be used on all field surveys, excavations and laboratory sessions.
2. A complete record of all field and laboratory work will be filed with the PCAS Curator and stored at a facility approved by the Society's Board of Directors.
3. No archaeological materials will be removed, without proper permits, landowner permission, and a field research design.
4. Unless otherwise stipulated before a field activity commences, all materials collected will be deposited for further research with the Curator, at a facility approved by the Society's Board of Directors.
5. All generated reports will be the property of the Society and distributed as deemed appropriate.
6. All Society field activities will be performed only under the direction of a qualified field archaeologist (Principal Investigator), and the supervision of field or site directors.
7. The above principles will be observed on both Society approved projects and projects performed under the direction of an authorized institution or organization.
8. The Society and members will strive to educate the public of the importance and proper management of our non-renewable cultural resources and discourage the collection and the commercial exploitation of archaeological materials.
9. PCAS members shall not benefit from the acquisition, purchase, sale or trade of archaeological artifacts, materials, or specimens.
10. All members shall adhere to City, County, State, and Federal antiquities laws.
